

## **World Without Cows**

It's not black and white.

Amid narrow views about cows and climate change, two journalists who now work in agriculture began a journey that would take them from the heartland of the United States to Kenya, India, Brazil and beyond as they sought to answer to one seemingly simple question, "Are we better off in a world without cows?"

With unique global access to those on the frontlines of agriculture and science, Michelle Michael and Brandon Whitworth spoke with farmers, ranchers, agricultural and environmental scientists, economists and other experts about the cultural and economic significance of cows, their role in nourishing the world and their impact on climate. What they found was far from simple: When it comes to cows, it's not black and white.

The resulting documentary, **World Without Cows**, features a diverse group of food security experts who explore the true impact of cows from a cultural, social, economic, nutritional and environmental perspective. This science-led discussion highlights the profound dependence on cows in many regions of the world, the challenges of nourishing an ever-expanding global population, the essential value of animal protein, and the complex relationship between cows and the environment.

In their search for the complexity behind often-simplified debates, Michelle and Brandon also discover that

while cows account for 5% of global greenhouse gas emissions, they also help keep the soil healthy, pull carbon from the air into the ground, support biodiversity on grazing lands, turn waste we can't eat into nutrient-dense food we need, and more.

World Without Cows **aims to broaden the conversation**, encouraging viewers to join Michelle and Brandon's global journey, to inspire deeper reflection, and to learn together about cows' role in the vitality of our planet.
